

Biodiversity

-The variety of plant and animal life in the world or in a particular habitat, a high level of which is usually considered to be important and desirable.

What we did well:

- Many students have planted a seed in their lifetime.
- Students can name a few threats to the biodiversity of our planet.
- Our school encourages students to help in any way possible.

- Our school could have wildlife accommodation built and placed in areas in the neighbourhood if possible.
- Our school could section areas for rewilding to increase biodiversity in the school.
- Teachers could introduce and mention threats to the biodiversity in their lessons.

Marine

-Relating to or found in the sea

What we did well:

- Our school has tried to reduce the use of any type of single-use plastics (these are impossible to ban entirely).
- Note: This specific topic is quite hard to deal with as a school as we do not have access to any body of water.

- Our school should ban balloon releases and glitter.
- The school should plan fundraisers for marine life conservation (and bring awareness to it).
- We could try use artwork or sculpture to highlight the threat of single-use plastics to the marine life.

<u>Energy</u>

-Power derived from the utilization of physical or chemical resources, especially to provide light and heat or to work machines.

What we did well:

- Our school has light monitors responsible for checking all lights and electronics are turned off when not in use.
- Students know of ways they can save energy both at home and at school.
- During break and lunch, light are switched off around the school when rooms are empty.

- Have energy-free days or energysaving week planned at school or something similar.
- Have an accessible smart meter for the school.
- Install motion -sensor lights at school that switch off when not in use.
- Add draught strips onto windows and doors at school.

Litter

-Rubbish such as paper, cans, and bottles left lying in an open or public place

What we did well:

- Our school owns litterpicking equipment.
- Our school has several bins inside and outside the building which are regularly emptied.
- Students can name different reasons why litter is bad and why we need to tackle the issue.

- Our school could
 participate in Keep Britain
 Tidy's Great Big School
 Clean this year.
- Develop an anti-litter campaign for the school
- Organise regular litter-picks by the school.

Global Citizenship

-The idea that all people have civic responsibilities to the world as a whole, rather than just their local communities or countries.

What we did well:

- We have raised money for a charity recently at least once.
- Our school has collected for a local foodbank/in support of a local charity in the last twelve months.
- Many staff and students are able to name at least one of the seventeen Sustainable Development Goals.

- Our school can try host a fair-trade cake sale or coffee morning.
- Try raise money for the environment, wildlife or animal welfare charities.
- Have students take charge, organise and plan a fundraiser event.



School Grounds

What we did well:

- Our school has an outdoor area where students can eat lunch.
- Some teachers have done their lessons outside.

- We should have an outdoor learning area.
- A gardening club or gardening lessons should be made.
- More teachers should do lessons outside.
- The school should have an indoor plant for students to look after.



Waste

-Use or expend carelessly, extravagantly, or to no purpose

What we did well:

- The school teaches students correct recycling practices.
- The schools works with the Café to reduce food waste.
- We have someone responsible for collecting waste.

- Have the school's waste composted and used within the school grounds if possible.
- Organise a second-hand clothes sale.
- Help the school recycle electronic waste.

Healthy living

What we did well:

- Our school has a range of healthy foods as a part of Café Amore.
- Our school discusses mental health issues and provide strategies to manage them.
- Many students use renewable bottles at school.

How can we improve:

- Distribute healthy recipe ideas for students and families to try at home.
- Sell fruits and vegetables to snacl on as part of the café.
- Have a natural area where students can relax and focus on their mental-well-being.

<u>Water</u>

What we did well:

- Students are taught how to save water in their dayto-day life.
- Students are aware of different issues regarding clean water availability in other countries.
- Water meter is accessible to students to see.

- Have the school campaign for water-based charities like Water Aid.
- The school could get intouch with the water suppliers to visit their sites or invite them to our school.
- Install water-saving devices into the school where possible.

Transport

-To take or carry (people or goods) from one place to another by means of a vehicle, aircraft, or ship.

What we did well:

- Many students walk, cycle or use public transport to get to school.
- Our school has a staff car sharing scheme.
- We encourage students to travel to/from school without using a vehicle at least once a week.

- Our school could provide training for cycle safety if possible.
- Our school could deliver a student-led antiidling campaign.
- Have a dry, safe area to store bicycles that belong to staff or students.
