


Our Year of 2020/2021




1 - Farewell to our Year 11 pupils



May Allah SWT grant you success and keep you all safe ameen. Wassalam


Pupil Progress Data - Assessments and Reports

90% say they are pleased with their child's progress at the school.


Mental Health

Children's Mental Health Week 1st-7th February 2021 : Express Yourself Activity



Skills Builder Silver Award



- We have made great strides in implementing our Skillsbuilder program across the school and have been awarded a silver award in our first year. The pupils have been partaking in short 20–30- minute sessions in their PE and Citizenship lessons where every learner has opportunities to build eight essential skills to support them now and in the future. These skills are listening, speaking, problem solving, staying positive, teamwork, leadership, creativity and aiming high. Each skill is divided into 15 steps for which we have set a target for each year group. Year 7 have reached Step 6, Year 8 have reached Step 9, Year 9 have reached Step 12 and Year 10 have reached Step 15.

Congratulations to all the pupils and parents of the pupils who received awards, Masha'Allah.




This year, we have introduced a new Houses and points system which has been a great success Alhamdulillah and has worked to motivate pupils to strive longer and harder.

Additionally, all schools were visited by members of the team to assess various elements of the school grounds growing area. The criteria were:

•Use of site – how the available space has been used and how it fits in to the wider school site. Condition of cultivation – how well the area is maintained.

•Crop – not solely based on size or abundance of crop but on the suitability of the crop for the site and how it will be used.

•X-Factor - demonstration of how the competition is integrated into teaching and the food growing is included in the curriculum. •Environmental practice - use of environmentally friendly practices such as planting for pollinators, use of peat-free compost and rainwater harvesting.

All the judges were impressed with the quality of growing areas on show.


Bebras Competition



New Academic Year 2021-22

School Re-opening

We look forward to welcoming our pupils back to School on Wednesday 25th August Insha'Allah.

We will update parents if the Government issue any new guidelines regarding the return to school in regards to Covid-19 restrictions. We kindly request that all parents check emails and Dojo communications in the days prior to Wednesday August 25th to ensure proceedings run smoothly.

Uniform

Every pupil is expected to always adhere to the school uniform, without exception. Please take some time to look carefully at the detailed requirements of the Academy's school uniform. If a pupil comes to school in the incorrect uniform, school staff will call home and a parent/carer will be asked to kindly bring in the correct uniform on that day.

Uniform must be fitting well and can be purchased from Islamic Establishment.

For the new academic year, the uniform will stay the same, the only change is that the colour of the PE tops has changed to blue for any pupils who buy a new top this year. Pupils who currently have a white top, can continue wearing the white top until they want to purchase a new top in future.



EQUIPMENT LIST

Every pupil is expected to provide the following basic items of equipment for every lesson:

Correction fluid/tape is not allowed in school and must not be used in any school work. Text books will be issued on loan and pupils will be required to pay for any loss or damage to school property.

THE JGA PRIMARY SCHOOL UNIFORM

The school navy blue pull-on scarf Scarf should be worn properly with neck covered.

All hair should be tucked in neatly with an under cap.

The school grey abaya. Uniform should be neat and tidy.

Smart, black, wide leg school trousers

No leggings or jeans.

Plain black plimsolls.

Plimsolls should be worn properly with laces tied/ Velcro fastened.

The foot must be firmly secured inside the shoe.

P.E. Uniform

Plain white, knee length tennis dress. Black / navy / dark grey plain jogging bottoms (wide or straight leg; no sports leggings).

Dark trainers with minimal detail.

Consequences for NOT adhering to the correct uniform

If an offending item can be removed in school, it will be confiscated till the end of term, e.g. cardigans, hooded tops, jackets. Items such as sharp pins will be discarded. If an item cannot be removed, pupils must work in isolation until the item is bought from home. 1

No jewellery

Stud earring and watches may be worn but must be removed before PE lessons.

Dark, plain school

rucksack / shoulder bag No branded logos or any other design

Black school

cardigans ONLY No casual cardigans,

blazers or gilets.

Coat / Outerwear

Must be smart and plain in colour/design.

No hooded tops/ sweatshirt/sports tops/denim or leather jackets in school or on the way to or from school.

School Shoes

Plain black smart shoes or smart flat ankle boots only. No wheeled shoes or trainers.

The school navy blue scarf

Scarf should be worn properly with neck covered.

All hair should be tucked in neatly under the scarf.

Scarf should be secured with a grip pin at the side. NO sharp pins allowed

The school grey abaya.

Uniform should be neat and tidy.

Smart, black, wide leg school trousers

No leggings or jeans.

Plain black plimsolls.

Plimsolls should be worn properly with laces tied/ Velcro fastened.

The foot must be firmly secured inside the shoe.


