

WHAT WILL WE LEARN THIS TERM?



ENGLISH

NON FICTION- REPORTS (WOLVES)



Read *Wolves in the Walls* (Gaiman) and *Wolves* (Gravett) for features of non-chronological reports. We will use adverbs, prepositions and conjunctions of time and cause. We will then write our own reports.

FICTION-MYTHS AND LEGENDS (LEGENDS OF THE SEA)

Using captivating mythical stories of selkies and mermaids, we will use our reading skills and write our own sea myths. We will set out and punctuate dialogue and use paragraphs.



SCIENCE

SOUND

- Identify how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating.
- Recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear.
- Find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it.
- Find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it.
- Recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.

MATHS

MULTIPLICATION AND DIVISION




- Recognise and use factor pairs and commutativity in mental calculations.
- Recall multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables up to 12×12 .
- Solve problems involving multiplying and adding, including using the distributive law to multiply 2-digit numbers by 1 digit, integer scaling problems and harder correspondence problems such as n objects are connected to m objects.
- Multiply 2-digit and 3-digit numbers by a 1-digit number using formal written layout.
- Use place value, known and derived facts to multiply and divide mentally, including multiplying by 0 and 1; dividing by 1; multiplying together 3 numbers.



LENGTH AND PERIMETER

- Convert between different units of measure [for example, kilometre to metre; hour to minute]
- Measure and calculate the perimeter of a rectilinear figure (including squares) in centimetres and metres



GEOGRAPHY

VOLCANOES

Within this topic, we will learn and understand the different key aspects of physical geography in the context of volcanoes. We will identify how volcanoes are formed and how these physical features have an affect on people's lives.
